DEAN CASTLE COUNTRY PARK ORIENTEERING COURSE (SHORT, 1.4KM)

The start of our brand new orienteering course is at the main car park. This is marked on your map by a red triangle, and on the ground by a post with an orange/white square. Try and use your map to guide you to all the numbered 'controls' within the park. Controls are orange/white squares, fixed to a wooden post or other permanent structure. See the table below for more detail. It is best to follow the numerical order, as this will lead you across the terrain in a logical fashion. As you will see from the table below, we are asking you to gather the two letter code printed on every control. This is your proof that you have been there!

For an extra challenge, every two letter code represents the common name of a mammal, amphibian, flower or bird found in the UK. To get you started, control No. 1 has the letters BO.....no, it's not body odour, but BARN OWL! Can you guess the rest?
